Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium is additional funding provided by the Department for Education to enhance the education of children living in the most socio-economically deprived areas of the country. This distinct group comprises students entitled to free school meals and also looked after children.

The pupil premium gives schools extra funding to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils from reception to year 11.

The Pupil Premium for 2014/2015 included pupils on the January 2014 School Census known to have been eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in any of the previous six years, as well as those first known to be eligible at January 2014.

Based on GCSE grades at the end of Year 11 pupils in receipt of pupil Premium are out performing other students in terms of expected progress in English.

Overall for A*- C including English and Mathematics there is a small gap in expected attainment.

Overview of PPG Spending 2014/ 2015

The school was allocated £60034.63 within the financial year 2014/2015. This was utilised to enhance pupils learning as follows.

To raise the attainment and improve the progress of those students entitled to the PPG

- To significantly close the attainment gap between Studio School students entitled to the PPG and the attainment of students nationally
- To ensure that the proportions of students entitled to the PPG making expected progress in Mathematics and English is similar to their peers who are less disadvantaged.
